Label your Clothing...



Stop look listen live



The JRSOs recently delivered a 'Staying Safe on the school site premises' assembly for the children. The children stressed the importance of staying on the path when entering and leaving the school premises. The drive up to the school is in effect a road and many cars and vehicles use this to access the different premises as well as the school. There are occasions when

parents and children are walking on the drive and this is obviously not safe. Whilst we are aware that the path is often busy, we would ask that people are considerate of each other and use the path appropriately ensuring that all parents and children are kept safe. In order to keep the children and everyone else using the school safe, we would like to ask for your support in using the zebra crossings. Everyone can help by doing the following:

- Care should be taken using the zebra crossing and you must wait for approaching vehicles to stop.
- Children and adults are not allowed to cycle on the drive to and from school.
- Children using bicycles and scooters should not cycle on the paths
- Children and adults are also not permitted to use the steep grass verge near the gates.
- Children must not run down the slope and into the road (They are at risk of collision with incoming vehicles.)

The JRSOs and staff will be patrolling the area to monitor the use of the path. Please help us to improve safety when entering and leaving the school premises .

Skip Beatz- A World Record Breaker!

Pete from Skip Beatz came in to present an assembly and he spoke about his recent attempt at breaking a skipping record. He had to beat 93 skipping cross overs in 60 seconds. Pete was successful and now holds the world record for 110 cross overs in 60 seconds. Surrey Street Football League

The Surrey Street Football League is a 4-team league that runs for children in years 4, 5 and 6 that attend football club on a weekly basis. The league was set up to provide competitive football for children, even if they have never competed before. Players were sorted into four evenly-matched teams and given a manager and team name. To be part of the league, players must attend training each week (failure to attend will result in missing the next week's games). Behaviour in school is also taken into consideration regarding children's selection each week. If a player's behaviour in-school is not acceptable, they will miss that week's game. However, each week results in a fresh start so that children can earn their way back into the team. Our vision for the football league is that children will develop life skills in order to help them become both good young players and good young people. We are now halfway through our season and already the improvement in the quality of football is evident. Keep up the good work all players!



School Uniform Reminder

The basic uniform is:

- Black or grey skirt, pinafore dress or trousers
- White shirt or blouse
- School tie (KS2) optional
- Red jumper /red school sweatshirt or cardigan with logo if desired
- Red or white polo shirt
- Tights and socks should be plain and in school colours when worn with skirts
- Sensible shoes in school colours .
(not high heeled, jelly shoes, trainers or clogs)

In the summer girls may wear a red gingham school dress, boys may wear uniform grey shorts. A hijab may be worn provided it is removed or tucked in securely for PE and is of an all in one design and red, white, green or black.
