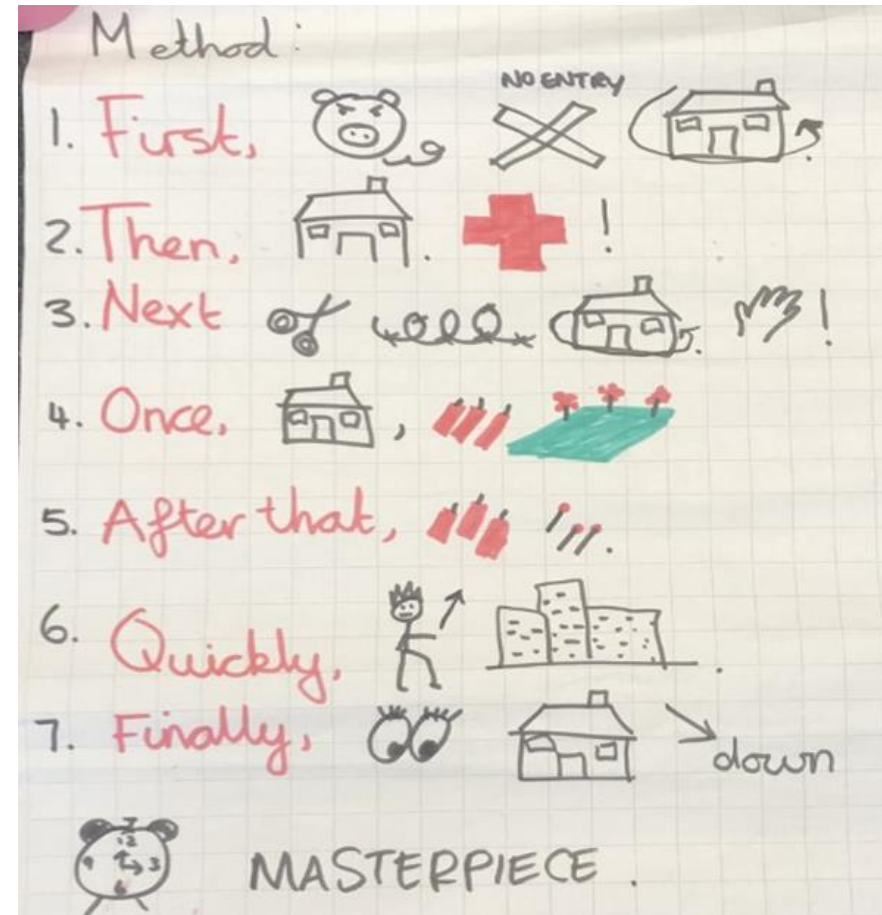
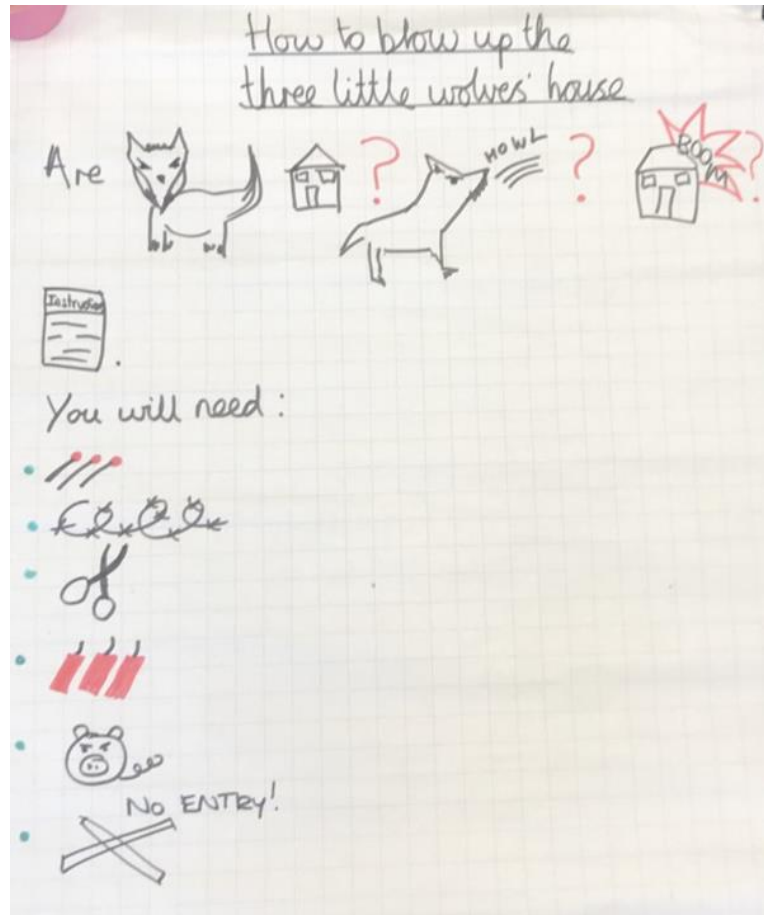
Singular = one of a thing

- Adverbs of time tell us **when** an action happened, but also **for how long**, and **how often**.

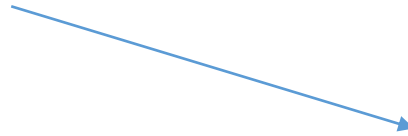

## How to blow up the three little wolves' house.





Are there wolves living near you? Are you fed up with them howling? Have you ever wanted to blow up their house? If so, follow these instructions.

### You will need:

- Matchsticks
- Barbed wire]
- Wire cutters
- 3 bars of dynamite
- A sneaky pig
- No entry, yellow tape



### Method:

	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. First, get the sneaky pig to tie the no entry yellow tape around the house.</li><li>2. Then, make sure the area surrounding the house is clear. There should be no casualties!</li></ol>
	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>3. Next, cut a vast amount of barbed wire and wrap it around the house. Be careful not to cut your fingers!</li><li>4. Once, the house is securely tied up, place the three bars of dynamite onto the lawn.</li><li>5. After that, carefully, light the dynamite using the matchsticks.</li></ol>
	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>6. Quickly, step away from the building.</li></ol>
	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>7. Finally, sit back and watch the house crumble down.</li></ol>
